Fr Murray: In Baptism, Tony received the light of Christ. He walked as a child of the light and kept the flame of faith alive in his heart.

Symbols of Tony's life include his cricket umpires' hat, his assorted cricket caps including a Premiership cap with East Wagga and various sporting intrests.
