My Scones

2 cups A.P. Flour - ~~1~~ 1 1/2 cups  
 1/2 - 3/4 cup Cream + 1/2 teaspoon salt  
 dry ingredients - mix in  
 milk if needed to make a soft  
 dough - pat into smooth  
 on a board + use cutter 4 cones  
 to cut scones - place on greased  
 tray + cook in hot oven 700°  
10 minutes



Banana Cake

125 gms Butter or substitute  
 1 cup Sugar  
 2 small eggs (beaten)  
 2 cups Flour (Plain)  
 2 level Teaspoons B. Powder  
 1 level Teaspoon C. Soda (dissolved in  
 milk)  
 2 bananas (mashed)  
 2 tablespoons milk  
 cream butter + sugar (15 mins)  
Method - Mash bananas one  
 at a time. Add flour etc. alternately  
 with milk + soda.  
 Cook in round tin 1hr - 5 mins  
 on moderate oven







Complaux Sponge Sandwich

4 eggs  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  cup Caster sugar  
 1 cup Fieldless Complaux  
 pinch of salt  
 1 teaspoon Cream of tartar  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  Teaspoon Baking Soda  
 Vanilla

Method Grease 2x70cm deep-sided sponge tins - Dust with flour - Sift complaux bicarb soda & cream of tartar three times. Beat eggs & sugar together for 10 minutes. Fold in sifted ingredients.

Divide mixture evenly between tins  
 Bake in Moderate oven for 15 minutes.  
 Turn out onto clean tea towel  
 When cold join together with whipped cream  
 Ice on top -
